

Be Positive!

- PLEASE don't tell your child that you're not good in math...
- Numerous research studies have reinforced the significance of parents attitudes in persuading their adolescents' attitudes and achievement.
- According to one source from first article provided below, the sole factor in children's educational success is their parents and their attitudes towards learning.
- Parents' mathematical anxiety can have a negative effect on their children. Researchers observed that children who received math homework help from mathematically fearful parents showed weaker math achievements than their peers, which in turn resulted in increased math anxiety for the children themselves.

Homework Policy

- One missed homework assignment =
 - "No" for completion in gradebook
 - After-school detention where assignment must be completed
 - > Failure to attend or discuss detention with the teacher results in a Central detention
- 2 missed homework assignments =
 - > All consequences for missed assignment
 - Parents are contacted
- Every missed homework assignment after the 2nd=
 - All consequences for missed assignment
 - Parents are contacted
 - Central detention



Absent Policy



- Number of days absent = Number of school days students have to make up missing assignments
- It is the students' responsibility to look over the notes, learn the material on their own, and to meet with one of us if they have any difficulty understanding the material.
- If a student misses class but is present at school, it is his or her responsibility to obtain any missing work that school day!
